

An Island in the Moon: A Facsimile of the Manuscript



The manuscript of the dramatic satire known as *An Island in the Moon* sheds much light on William Blake at a formative stage in his artistic development. In the midst of this burlesque of his social and cultural milieu are the beginnings of the *Songs of Innocence and of Experience* (including three *Songs in draft*). There are references to *Illuminating the Manuscript* and to having the writing Engraved instead of Printed; examples of Blake practising copperplate script and mirror writing; and some sketches. A fresh transcript of the text is reproduced facing each corresponding page of the facsimile, and there is full annotation and an explanatory introduction. A second copy of the complete MS, sewn in a single section, is inserted at the back of the book.

Upon the discovery of the marginalia, their style and content prompted a comparison with a facsimile of Blake's prose manuscript *An Island in the Moon* (c. *An island in the moon : a facsimile of the manuscript*.
