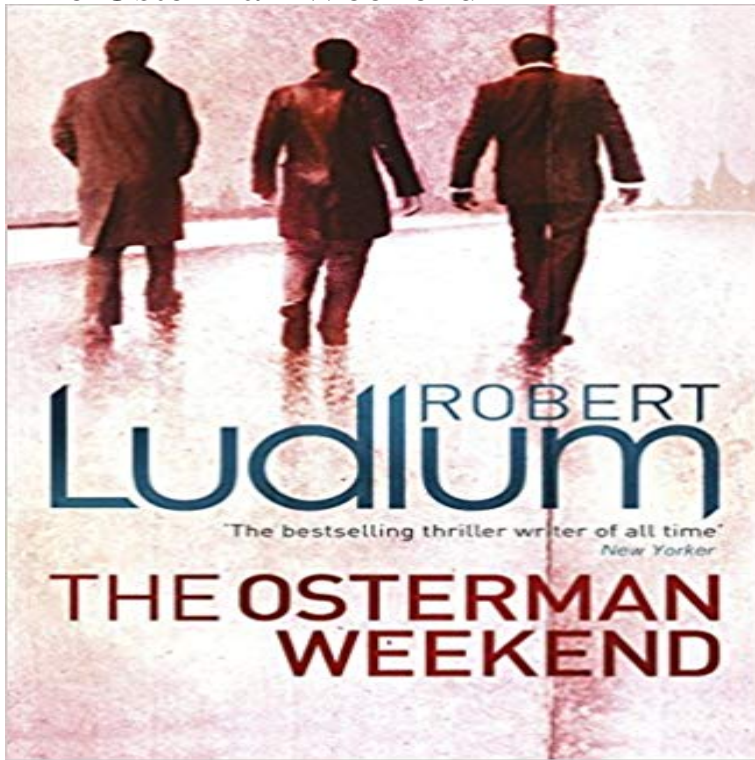


## The Osterman Weekend
